## For your information:

Every treatment that we recommend you undergo requires your consent. We are required by the legislature to inform you about the albeit very rare, but nevertheless potential complications involved. Within our obligation to inform, we refer to the following points:

- Any medication may cause adverse reactions, which are usually harmless when detected early.

To rule out interactions with other medications, please inform the attending physician about medications you already take.

- Hypersensitivity reactions (allergies) may occur in rare cases as an adverse side effect of medications – especially also local anaesthetics. Please inform the attending physician of any known allergies.

Severe incompatibility reactions and other life-threatening complications (e.g. cardiac arrest or respiratory arrest) are an absolute exception following the application of local anaesthetic procedures, even in the case of older age patients and patients with comorbidities.

- When indicated, treatment will involve being administered a local anaesthetic as well as a locally effective cortisone preparation. Since such medications are locally effective, only a small total dose is necessary. The use of a corticosteroid together with a local anaesthetic, intended in the case of a nerve block and joint injection, is currently not yet covered by authorisation under the provisions on medical products, but has established itself as good practice for several decades, and is used as off-label treatment.

- In rare cases, the injection of medications into or around a joint or aspiration (the drawing off of fluids) may lead to the occurrence of slight bleeding and nerve irritation, for example.

- In rare cases, the injection of medications into the region of the spinal column or of the spinal canal may also lead to slight bleeding or nerve irritation. Permanent paralysis as a result of haematomas, inflammation or nerve injury is extremely rare. It has never yet been observed in the treatments we provide. Injury to internal organs due to injection or aspiration treatments is an extremely rare complication.

- Temporary dysesthesia and/or temporary partial paralysis (muscle weakness) may occur as an effect of local anaesthetics in the case of injection treatments near the spine, and is limited to the duration of action of these drugs (a few hours).

- Infections (bacterial inflammations) occur extremely rarely (approx. 1:30,000) after an injection or aspiration, despite the use of the correct technique. It is an extremely rare exception for such an infection to develop into general blood poisoning (sepsis).

- It is extremely rare for chiropractic techniques to lead to serious complications. In very rare cases, herniated discs without any symptoms, which were as yet unknown, may be activated, leading to pain or irritation in the arms or legs. An ever rarer occurrence (approx. 1:400,000 to 1:2 million) is injury to blood vessels supplying the brain during chiropractic treatment to the cervical spine, which is rather unlikely when chiropractic therapy is performed properly.

In the event of an adverse reaction after treatment, and especially if you notice hyperthermia, fever, severe pain, reddening or swelling in the treated region after an injection, please notify us immediately by phone or come to our practice. If you are unable to reach us, please go to the medical emergency service or a hospital. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any further questions.
